How do you create space for difference and diversity in your school? How are you encouraging inclusion, open conversations, and connection?



The specific teaching emphasized through our programs is that appreciation for biodiversity in the land around us can lead to appreciation for the diversity among us as humans. The land knows that it needs diversity. We need it too, and we are stronger for it. This knowledge can help to build community and encourage belonging and inclusion to flourish and grow.

DIVERSITY SESSIONS









1. Community of Trees

Science, Social-Emotional Learning Skills

Just like trees act as a community to each other, so can you! This module encourages team building and inclusion, reminding you that you are part of a web of connections and that your individual actions matter to the whole.

2. Water is Life!

Science

Go for a guided hike along the water. Review the water cycle through an engaging game, discover creatures that live in the water, and reflect on the importance of water for all of life.

3. What's your Role?

Social-Emotional Learning Skills, Science

Each person has unique gifts and responsibilities, just like every creature and plant in the natural world. Learn about local ecosystems and the important role you play in the world.

4. No Two Alike

Visual Arts

Through earth art experiences inspired by artist Andy Goldsworthy, you'll use loose parts from the land to create ephemeral art, connecting to the topic of diversity and inclusion.



LAND-BASED ADVENTURES







1. Team Challenge

Work together towards a shared goal, build resiliency, value each other's unique skills, foster emotional skills by encouraging healthy competition, build strong bonds with one another.

2. Outdoor Living Skills

Practicing fun, ancient skills, helps us to connect with the essentials of what we truly need, puts us in touch with the natural world, and encourages confidence.

3. Wide Games

Often a favourite, wide games keep students active, helps physical development, strengthens gross motor skills, and best of all... releases energy!

4. Take a Hike!

Explore our Carolina old growth forest, up and over streamlets, follow the board walk through wetlands, identifying plants along the way.

Five Oaks is a unique, intercultural centre offering a safe space for educational and personal growth.

The rich, long-standing Carolinian forests on whose land Five Oaks is situated are teeming with life. Forests and land thrive through the symbiotic diversity of their many parts. Today, Five Oaks deliberately celebrates the rich diversity of human experience. All are welcomed to learn and to thrive here—within their own culture and spiritual practices, or by sharing in others' experiences.

To deepen the transformative experience of Five Oaks, we dreamed of developing a nature-based diversity curriculum. With heartfelt gratitude to writers Rebecca Seiling and Jan Sherman, **Diversity in the Land and Each Other** was born. May this curriculum nurture a deep relationship to the land, air, water and all living creatures, enabling meaningful conversation for change and seeking new ways to live together in harmony.

Five Oaks acknowledges that we gather on the traditional territory of the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabe peoples and acknowledge their stewardship of this land throughout the ages. We seek a new relationship with the Original Peoples of this land, one based in honour and deep respect.
