LETTER FROM THE E.D.

Thank you for your continued support of Five Oaks Centre. We wouldn't be here without you.

In October 2022, I had the privilege of co-organizing and attending a Racial Healing experience that brought together key leaders, members and partners to have an intentional community experience of deepening into how Five Oaks will live into our future as an Intercultural Retreat Centre. There were many key learnings that help to support our strategic direction for our programming and hosted groups, as well as continued and new community partnerships. There was a moment near the end of the retreat where as a group we offer a natural item into the creek as a release. I felt compelled to role up my pants and wade into the cool chilled water. I experienced a strong connection to the water and the land.

2022 was a year, while rebounding from the global pandemic, that posed other challenges that impacted our operations, yet despite these challenges have ended the year within the financial framework that was set out. There were significant increases in hosted groups and catering over 2020 and 2021, and increases in our programming. Our Acorn Adventure Day Camp was close to 100% sold out and our onsite partnerships ensured that Five Oaks was bustling during the summer months.

We are grateful for our community partnerships with Grand River Bookstore, Grand River Rafting, Brave Waves, GROWE Outdoor School, Rogers Ranch and others that continue to help Five Oaks find ways to share this sacred space with the wider community.

Near the end of last year, we began to dream of a program staffing partnership with three Regional Councils and are excited to have a new partnership and shared staffing. This will continue to deepen and strengthen our partnership with the United Church of Canada. I am also excited that an action arising from the Strategic Plan is the creation of a Partner Relations Working Group which will bring together diverse voices to impact and advise partnerships and programs going forward.

In 2022, our property experienced some vital upgrades, including a new roof on the Main Building, an accessible washroom off of the New Hall, and thanks to a \$100,000 regional tourism grant, a two story dining and sitting deck was built off the main

building to increase and offer three season seating off our dining room, and offer an outdoor gathering space off the Upper Room. Window installments were completed in House on the Hill, Friendship House and in select spaces in the main building. A large portion of the boardwalk, including one bridge were replaced. We continue to upgrade the spaces with the environment and our guests in mind.

We look forward to welcoming you back, sharing in programming, retreat, community, volunteering and all that brings you to Five Oaks.

Program Highlights and Growth

In October, a small group gathered for the Racial Healing Initiative, a process designed for retreat centre leaders to engage in transformative racial equity work, for themselves, their centers, and their local communities.

Five Oaks staff, board members, leaders and partners deepened into this process through spiritual practice, community sharing, circle process, individual reflection over a 4 day inperson retreat. We are deeply grateful for the learnings and outcomes from this experience.





A few words from our Settler Partner Program Director, Tanya Dyck Steinmann...

At the beginning of 2022, when the province was under lockdown and Public Health mandates, we offered three online programs: Journaling for Personal Growth with Peggy Guiler, Sister Water and the Sultan Len Desroches, and Step into Stories with Gail Fricker. In April, we celebrated our first in-person program with Heather Beamish who spent the week on-site, as Five Oaks' first Artist in Residence. On the weekend of September 30 (Orange Shirt Day), nineteen people from a variety of church traditions gathered around the Sacred Fire Pit at Five Oaks, to learn and reflect on the church's role in colonialism and residential schools. Registration for the next Seeking Transformation Retreat will be opening soon.

Numerous smaller programs were successfully offered this year, and a large area of focus was the development of a nature-based diversity school group program at Five Oaks, that started with the creation of a new curriculum, Diversity in the Land and Each Other, written by Forest Educator Rebecca Seiling and Indigenous Consultant, Jan Sherman. As this program was being developed, North Ward School approached us to help them take their classrooms outdoors. It was wonderful to see the awe and sheer delight of 100 kindergarteners, 120 Grade 1-3 students and over 70 Grade 4-8 students each connecting to the land while applying math, science, social skills and so much more.



The Five Oaks Program Team is so grateful for an impactful year of visioning, relationship building and connection.




2022 FINANCIAL SUMMARY


OPERATING REVENUE




